*Express Yourself...*



## CISCE ZONAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM - EMPOWERING EDUCATORS FOR THE FUTURE

The CISCE Zonal Professional Development Program was hosted at Christ School, as per the guidelines of the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE) on 8/7/25 & 9/7/25. Conducted in collaboration with CENTA, the two-day training was facilitated by Ms. Niveditha, an expert in Competency-Based Education (CBE) pedagogy and assessment design. The program was organized under the able guidance and meticulous planning of Rev. Fr. Nilson Davis CMI, Principal of Christ School.

A total of 50 teachers from various CISCE schools across Bangalore attended the sessions. The training aimed to help educators transition from traditional content-based teaching to competency-driven learning, equipping them with skills and strategies to ensure students acquire real-world competencies.

Day 1 focused on understanding CBE principles, framing measurable learning outcomes, designing Constructed Response Questions (CRQs), promoting inclusion in mixed-ability classrooms, and creating reflective rubrics. Day 2 covered writing high-quality Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) with diagnostic value, aligning assessments to learning goals, using assessment blueprints, and compiling a complete classroom-ready toolkit.

The sessions were highly interactive, blending theory with practical application. Participants left empowered and inspired to bring meaningful changes to their classrooms, making this event a milestone in advancing teacher development across CISCE schools in Bangalore.
